

# **Epidemic of Drug Mortality - Still Increasing**


Drug-Related Deaths, United States, 2000-2018

#### **Most Deaths Involve Multiple Drugs**


CDC NVSS: % Deaths Involving 2 or More Drugs

Estimated prevalence of lifetime Kratom use is 1.3% = 3,353,624 adults



**Kratom Abuse Profile Worse Than Prescription Opioids** 





## **Mortality of Prescription Stimulants is Rising**




