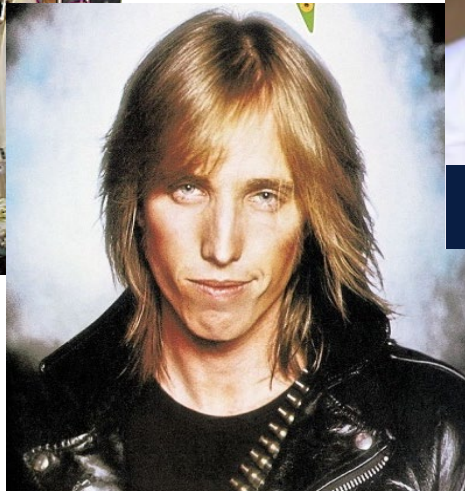
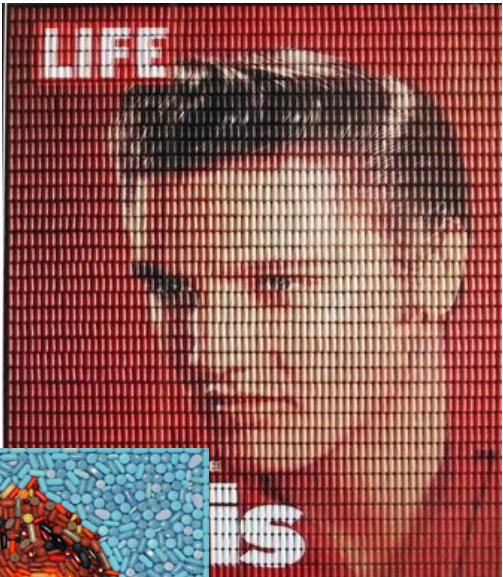

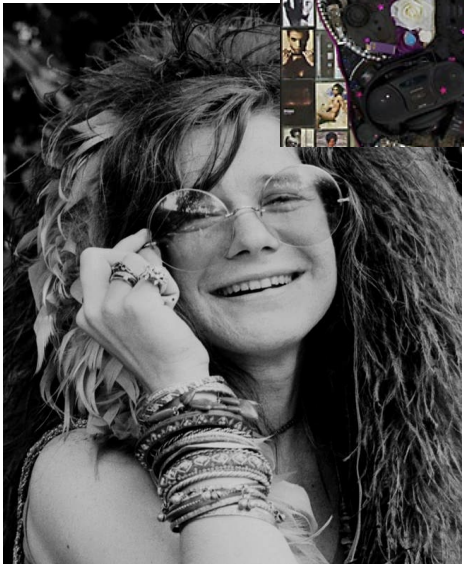
# Conflict of Interest Statement

- RADARS System is the property of Denver Health and Hospital Authority, a political subdivision of the State of Colorado





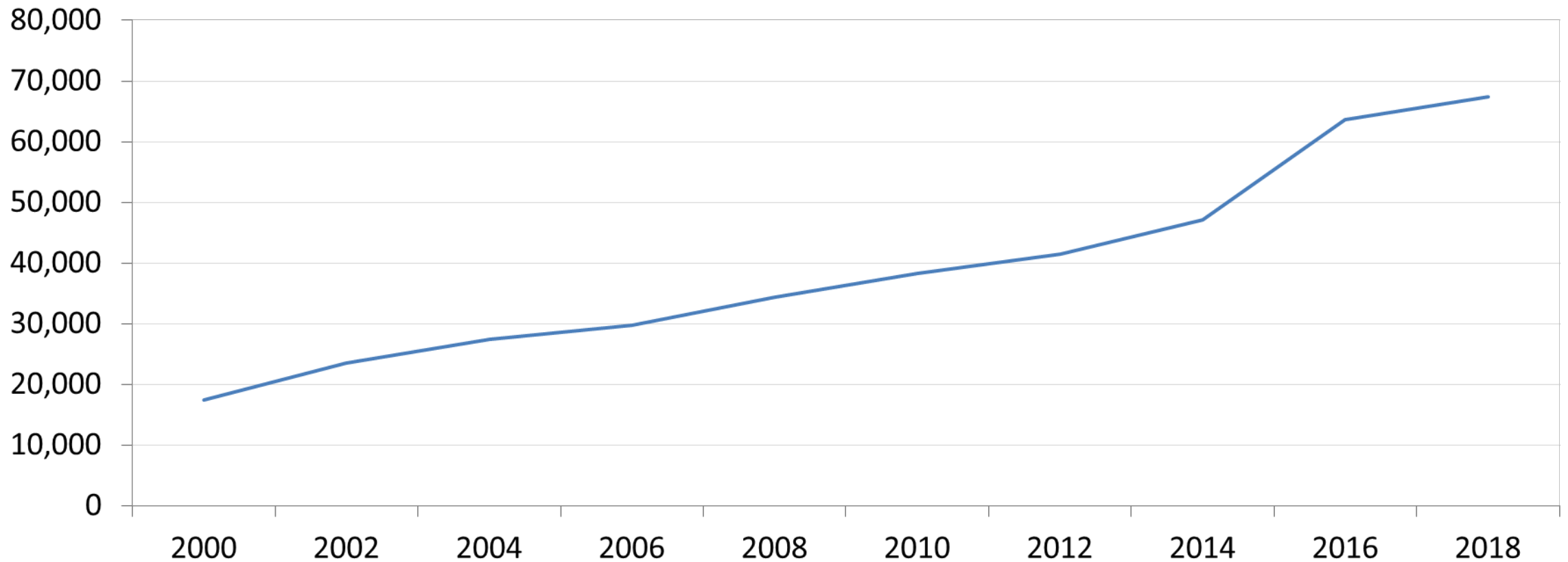

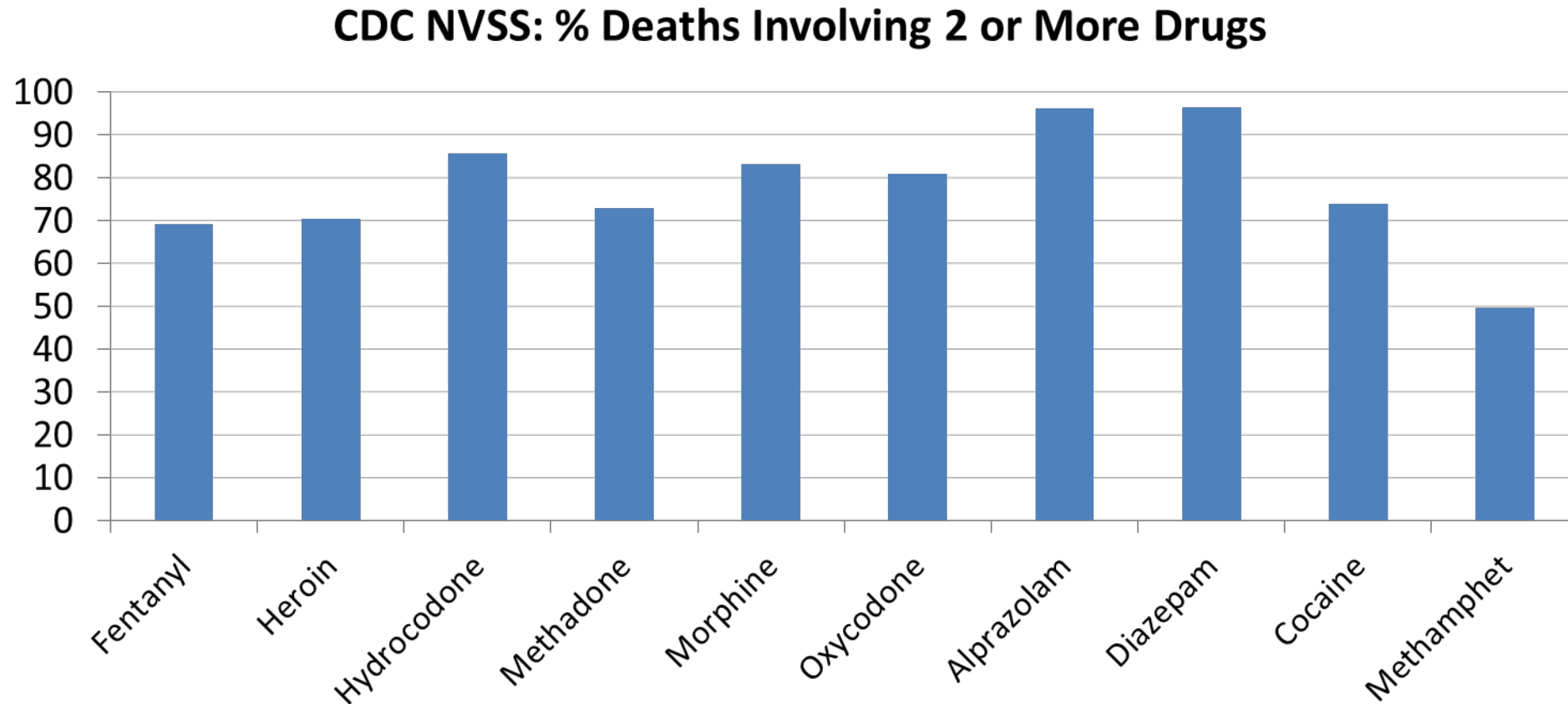


# Epidemic of Drug Mortality - Still Increasing

Drug-Related Deaths, United States, 2000-2018

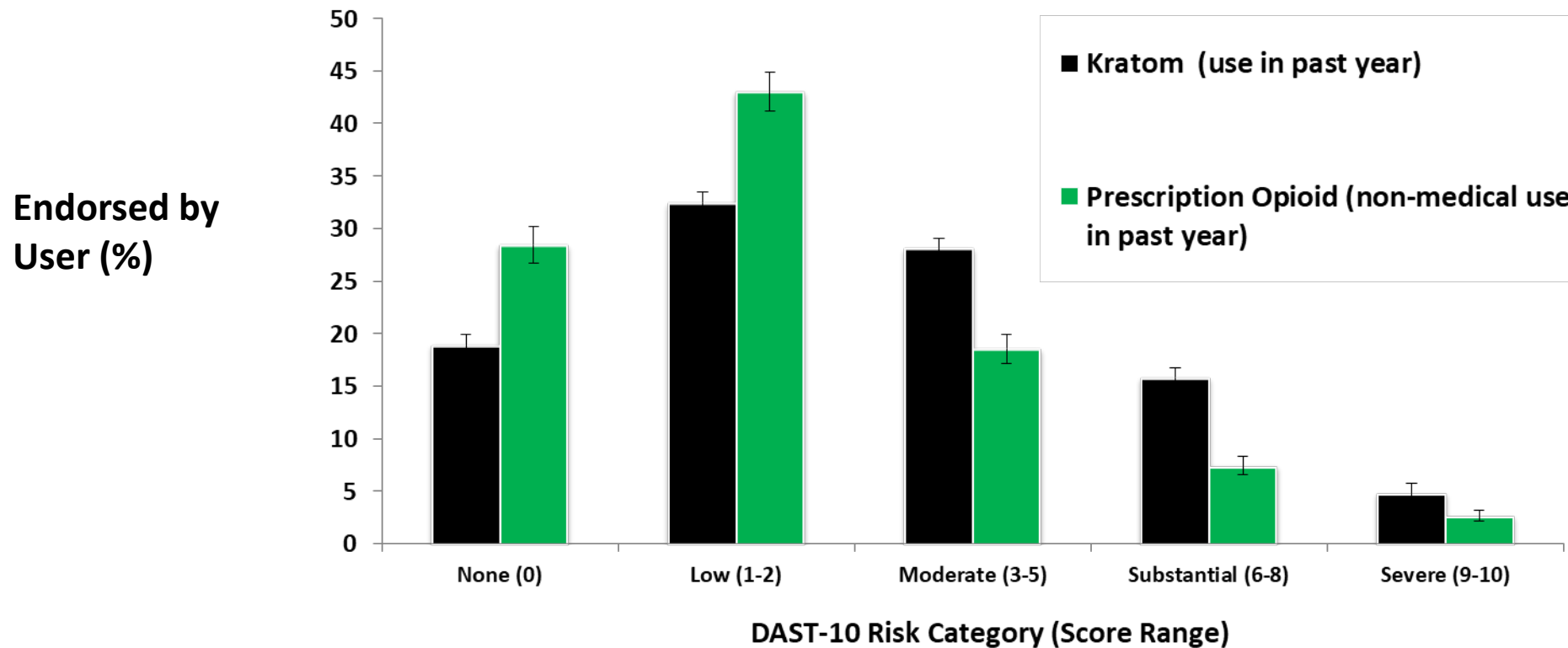


# Most Deaths Involve Multiple Drugs



# 3 Million Adults Have Used Kratom, NMURx, 2018-2019

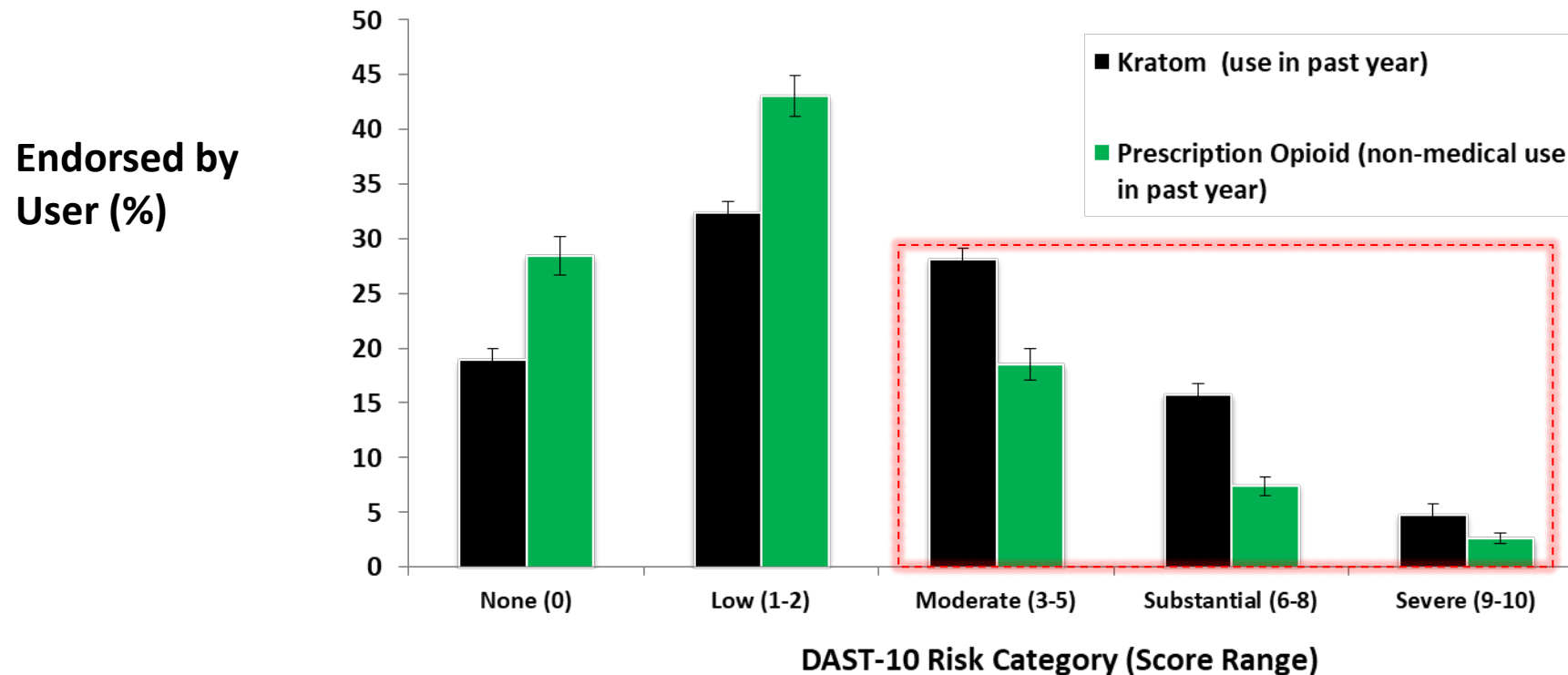
Estimated prevalence of lifetime Kratom use is 1.3% = 3,353,624 adults

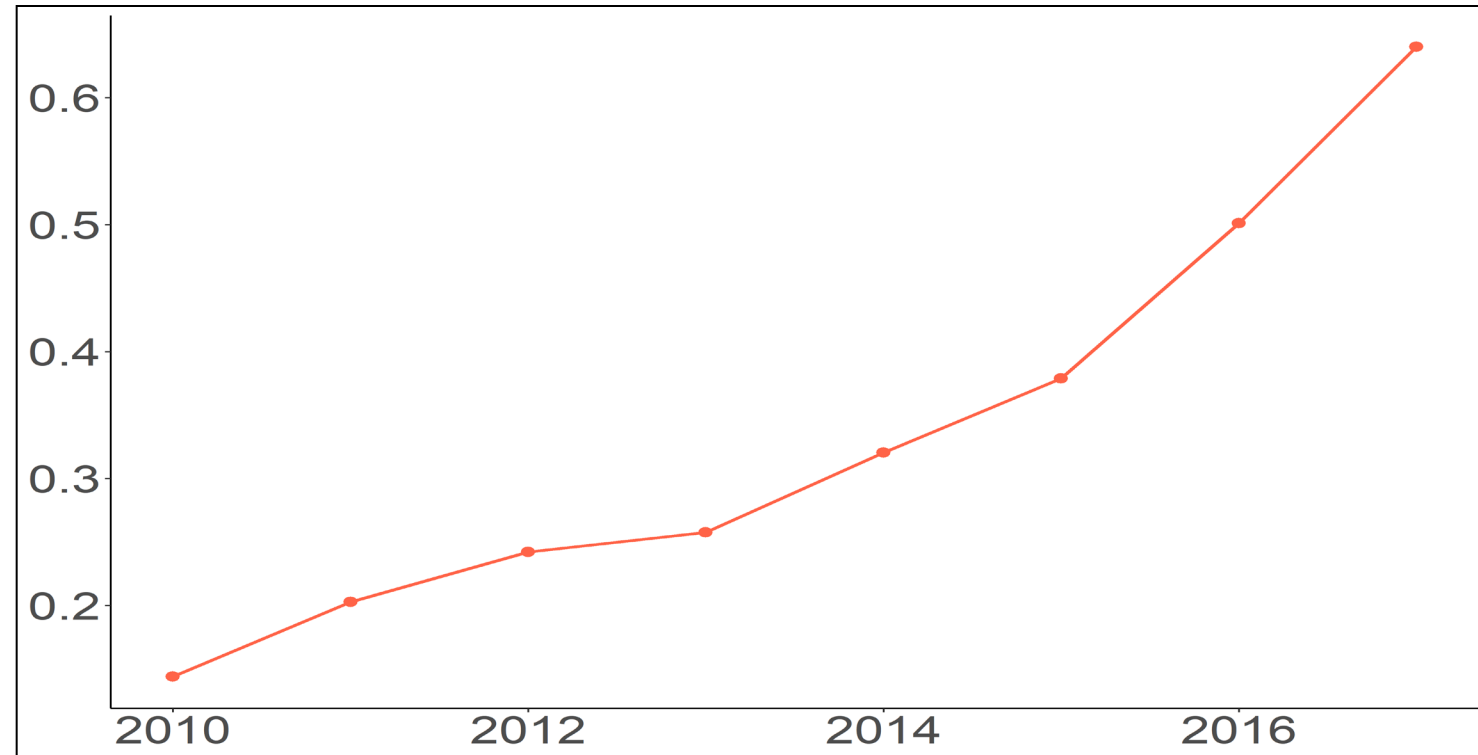
## Kratom Abuse Profile Worse Than Prescription Opioids

# Mortality of Prescription Stimulants is Rising

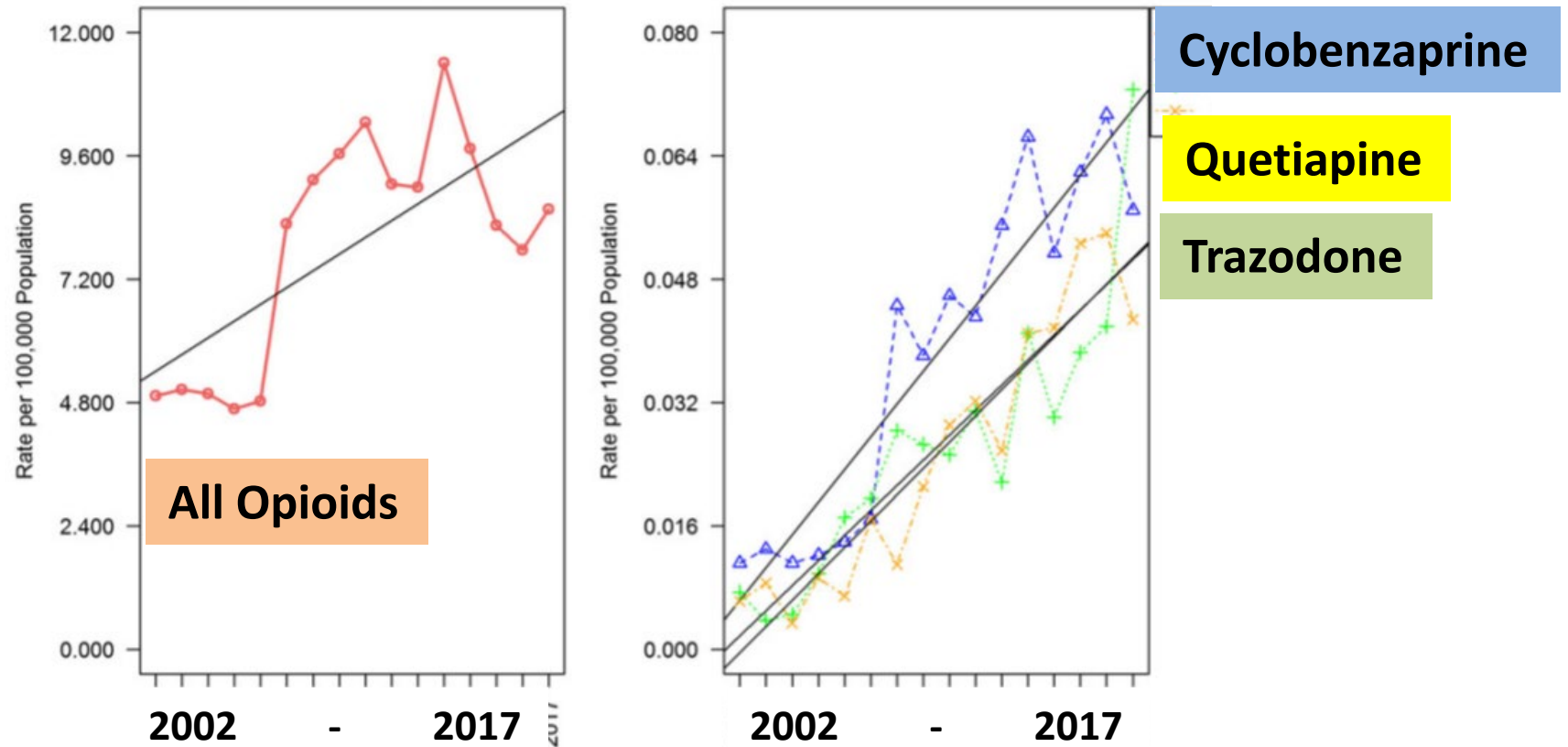
**Mortality Rate**

**Included: Cocaine, methamphetamine, MDMA, pseudoephedrine, amphetamine, methylphenidate, generic terms, other terms**

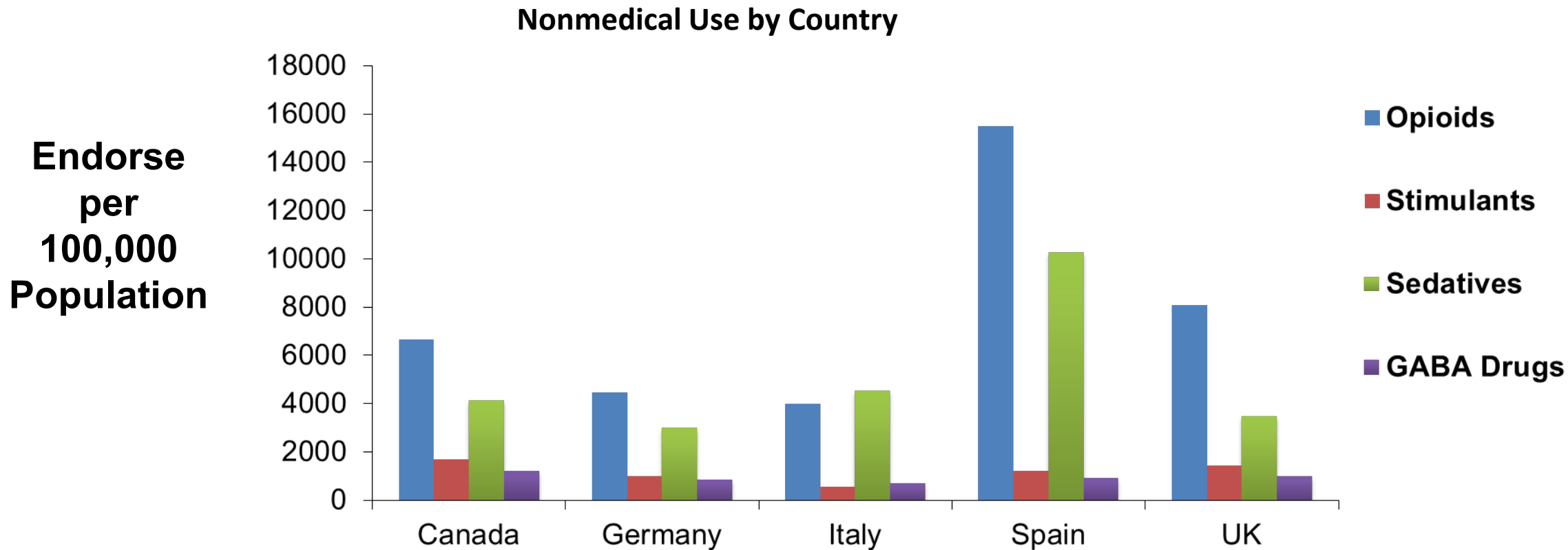


# Diversion of Nonscheduled Psychoactive Rx Medications in the US, 2002 - 2017
